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TRAINING COURSES – 2016-17 SEASON

MYC is an RYA Recognised Training Centre (RTC) and we offer RYA and other Training Courses to our members throughout the year. Courses can only be booked via the club website.

Winter Courses:

RYA Day Skipper – (Theory): A comprehensive introduction to chartwork navigation meteorology and the basics of seamanship. Invaluable for learning how to start making decisions on board and if you are considering taking the Day Skipper practical course. Content: Seamanship, coastal navigation and pilotage, chartwork, electronic charts, position fixing, plotting a course to steer, weather forecasting and meteorology, tides, collision regulations. It involves 40 hours of study over 15 three hour classroom sessions run on Monday evenings from 31 October 2016 to 20 Feb 2017.

RYA: Marine VHF Radio - Short Range Certificate (SRC): A radio is an essential piece of safety equipment, and it is vital to understand and implement the correct procedures. If you own a fixed or hand-held marine VHF radio, you must hold this Certificate by law. This is a one-day Course with a ten hour syllabus. An essential pre-study pack will be sent to you in advance of the course and counts for 3 of the 10 hours of the syllabus. The course includes practical training on Digital Selective Calling (DSC) and emergency procedures and will be examined by a short written examination and practical test at the end of the day by an independent examiner.

RYA: Diesel Engine Maintenance: Mechanical failure is the main cause of lifeboat callouts. Basic maintenance and engine care experience may ensure you don't become part of these statistics. This one-day Course gives you the ability to take simple measures to prevent mechanical breakdown at sea and rectify defects that do not require workshop support.

RYA: Introduction to RADAR: Sailing and motor yachts increasingly have RADAR on board, and the IRPCS state that, if you have it on board, you must know how to use it. This one-day Course provides an understanding of RADAR as an aid to navigation and collision avoidance.

RYA: First Aid at Sea: In a medical emergency at sea a little first aid knowledge and immediate action can save lives. This one-day Course provides a working knowledge of first aid for people using small craft. It also satisfies the requirements of some categories of commercial work afloat. First Aid Certificates are only valid for 3-years, so check if yours needs renewal this year!

MYC: Basic Boat Electrics: Successfully introduced last year, this is a 4 hour course covering a bit of theory, 12 and 240 volt systems, busbars, electrical installation, batteries, alternators, troubleshooting, solar panels and fuses.

MYC: Electronic Navigation Techniques: This is a half-day Course which focuses on making the transition from basic to electronic navigation techniques, and the use of GPS and Chart Plotters. It is based around the RYA DVD entitled 'The Electronic Yachtmaster' by Tom Cunliffe.

MYC: RADAR – Follow-Up: This half-day Course is for those who have already taken the RYA Introduction to RADAR course and who are looking to further their knowledge of the practical uses of RADAR at sea. Not available this year.

MYC: Introduction to AIS: AIS (Automated Identification System) enables vessels and shore stations to transmit and receive information regarding identification, position, course and speed of vessels via VHF radio. This half-day course covers what AIS equipment can offer you in terms of navigation and safety aids.

MYC: Diesel Engine Trouble-Shooting: This half-day Course is for those who have already taken the RYA Diesel Engine Maintenance course, and who wish to extend their knowledge, particularly in respect of trouble-shooting a range of problems.

Spring & Summer Courses: Powerboat Training – General Information: In order to Coxswain the club RIB members must hold at least the RYA Power Boat Level 2 Certificate (PBL.2) and must be at least 18-Years old. This is also the minimum requirement when operating as the Safety Boat for MYC club racing. Club racing cannot take place without a pool of members qualified to coxswain/crew the Safety Boat, so members are strongly encouraged to take the PBL2 and then to add their names to the Racing Section's List of Volunteers for RIB Duty.

RYA: Powerboat Level 2 Certificate (PBL2): Normally offered as a two-day Course, but those with considerable prior experience may present themselves directly for the assessment. The practical assessment covers a range of manoeuvres and boat handling skills plus an oral/written test covering the theory. This includes a working knowledge of collision regulations, safety at sea, pilotage and navigation. Certification is now held on the RYA On-line Central Registration Scheme.

Pay your course fee online as directed. Once your payment has been accepted ongoing communication will be by email. Training courses are run by our suitably qualified and experienced members.

MYC has a comfortable classroom with a modern visual aid suite and access to WiFi. A charge is levied for each course, but you will find them well below that of any of the local commercial establishments offering similar courses. You will also be provided with relevant RYA publications, where applicable, as part of your course fee.
